The Teaching and Learning Collaborative (TLC) invites Graduate Students to enroll in our *College Teaching Preparation* program. Being a new instructor is both an opportunity and a challenge. Participating in this program will prepare you to meet teaching-related challenges and provide you with the opportunity to work with professional educators to learn and practice new teaching skills. The program focuses on six areas of teaching:



The following activities are required to complete the program and will help to develop your skills as an instructor as you work through each:

- Identification of a faculty teaching mentor within the discipline and observation and reflection on the mentor's teaching
- Development of an electronic teaching portfolio (which will include the following items)
  - o Attendance at a minimum of eight (8) TLC workshops (some required topics, some electives)
  - o The development of your own personal teaching philosophy
  - o Development of a course syllabus
  - o Classroom observation or microteaching session of your own teaching (of the student's teaching) conducted with either the faculty mentor or TLC staff, with formal feedback
  - o Collection, analysis, and reflection upon formal or informal student feedback on teaching
  - o Articulation of your future teaching goals as you grow professionally
- Exit interview/survey upon completion of the program
